Admission



Session

Applications are invited from the Bangladeshi and foreign students for admission in to First Year MBBS for the specified session.

Academic requirements for Bangladeshi students

- SSC or equivalent examination in specified years and HSC or equivalent examination in specified years with Physics, Chemistry and Biology.
- Minimum combined GPA of 9.0. Minimum GPA of 3.5 in Biology in HSC. Candidate referred in any examination will not be accepted.
- Students who have undertaken O and A level examinations should submit equivalence certificates to be collected from the Directorate General of Medical Education (DGME), Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh along with the application.

Selection Process

(for national student)

- Final selection will be based on a written assessment, GPA scores and medical fitness.
- Selection will be absolutely on merit, based on scores of:

(SSC GPA x 15) + (HSC GPA x 25)	= 200
Written Admission Test	= 100
Total	= 300

- The written admission test will be conducted by the Directorate General of Medical Education (DGME). Selection of the candidate will be accomplished following the merit list announced by the DGME for the private medical colleges.
- Qualified candidates are invited to an interview by a board of medical specialists of Medical College Hospital of Ad-din Foundation (AWMC, ASWMC, AMMC, AAMC & BRHMC), to review and confirm their physical fitness. It is mandatory for the candidate to qualify in the physical fitness tests.



Application Process



- The candidate should collect and submit the application form in person.
- The following documents should be submitted along with the application:
 1. Attested photocopies of SSC Certificate and academic transcript or equivalent examination certificate.
 2. Attested photocopies of HSC Certificate/testimonial and academic transcript or equivalent examination certificate.
 3. Attested five recent passport size colour photographs (same as admit card)
 4. Attested photocopy of the Citizenship Certificate from the City Corporation Mayor/ Municipal Mayor/ Union Parisad Chairman/ Ward Commissioner/Ward Councillor.
 5. Money receipt of application fee.
 6. Birth Certificate/NID

Original copies of all the above documents are to be submitted at the time of admission.

Admission Process

(for national student)

Candidates who fulfill the entry requirements, as per the results announced by the Directorate General of Medical Education (DGME), should submit the completed Application Form during office hours.

List of the selected candidates along with a waiting list will be displayed on the College Notice Board. Selected candidates are required to report to the College administration desk for admission at the specified date and time. In case of failure in admission by the selected candidates within the stipulated date and time, the vacant seat(s) will be filled up by the candidate(s) from the waiting list.

Applications with incomplete and incorrect information will not be accepted. Any willful inclusion of incorrect information will automatically disqualify the candidate.

Any decision made for admission related matters by the admission committee will be considered as final.

Direct Descendant of Freedom Fighter : Two percent seats are reserved for the direct descendants of Freedom Fighter as per Government criteria. For this seat(s) attested photocopy of certificate of father/mother/ grand father/grand mother in favour of her/his participation in the Liberation War signed by the Secretary and the honorable Minister/State Minister of the Ministry of Liberation War Affairs or the certificate countersigned by the then honorable Prime Minister during 1997 to 2001.

Students from underprivileged background : Five percent of seats are reserved under poor and merit quota. Candidates in this quota are being selected following the criteria set by the DGHS. They are placed under a separate merit list and can not be transferred to the general list or vice versa. A selection Committee formed by the Governing Body of the College will finalize the selection of these candidates. The selected candidates will pay fees following the guidelines of the DGHS. Students under this quota are required to serve the Hospitals of Ad-din for 2 years as paid Medical Officer after their graduation and internship.

Bond

The candidates and their parents or legal guardians are required to sign bonds on non-judicial stamps accepting the terms and conditions of the course, conduct and discipline before admission to the college.

Student Counsellor

Each student is assigned with an counsellor from among their teachers. The counsellor is responsible for providing general guidance and support to the student throughout the course.

College Hours

From 7.45 AM to 2:30 PM; Saturday to Thursday.

Conduct and Discipline

All students are required to abide by the rules and regulations of the college. Non-adherence to these rules and regulations will render the student liable to disciplinary action, which may range from issuing a warning to expulsion from the College.

Students are forbidden to organize any union, association or society other than those set up by the college authority in order to enrich their physical, intellectual and ethical development.

Uniform

Students are required to follow the dress code specified by the college authority.



General Rules

1. Transfers within these four Medical Colleges internally or to any other private medical colleges are not allowed.
2. All students are to attend classes in the prescribed uniform as specified by the College authority.
3. All students are to carry their identity cards when they are within the College and Hospital premises.
4. Attendance of 75% is mandatory for being eligible to appear in College and University examinations. Attendance will be evaluated quarterly. If any student attends less than 75% of the classes in a quarter, s/he shall have to pay a fine of Tk. 10,000.00 unless there are explanatory circumstances. Moreover, s/he will not be allowed to sit for any periodic examinations.
5. Students found absent from classes for a continuous period of one month without satisfactory reason or prior permission shall lose college studentship. Such a student may gain re-admission by paying a fee of Taka 25,000.00.
6. Absence from classes individually or in group or en-masse without prior information or without valid reasons is a punishable offence by imposition of a daily fine of Tk. 500.00 individually.
7. Putting up posters on the walls of the college premises is prohibited.
8. Closing of College and Hospital gates or doors and creating obstacles to the normal functioning of the College or the Hospital are acts of gross indiscipline where students involved in such acts are liable to be expelled from the College.
9. All types of demonstration, procession, shouting in the College and Hospital premises are prohibited, where students involved are liable to be expelled from the College.
10. Students may state their problems, grievances and inconvenience to their designated advisor or guide teacher. The advisor or guide teacher solves the problems of the students or refer them to the Principal. Statements of the problems, grievances and inconveniences by the students must be in an orderly and disciplined manner. Any act of indiscipline on the part of any student including violence, usage of abusive or objectionable language or creating unpleasant situation in the college campus will make the students liable to be punished by expulsion from the College.
11. Release of a student for admission into a govt. medical college will be entertained following replacement of a student of a medical college under same university or, payment of session charges and tuition fees of remaining years of the course to the college as compensation.
12. Every student shall provide for her/himself all the prescribed text books, dissecting instruments, medical equipment etc. The college will not supply these to the students.
13. Cost of loss, damage to college/ hospital property is liable to be realized from the student found responsible for the loss/ damage.

General Rules (cont'd)

14. All payments including course fee, session charge, tuition fees, etc. are non-refundable.
15. Residing in college hostel is mandatory for the students to be admitted in Ad-din Momin Medical College and Ad-din Akij Medical College. College authority of Ad-din Women's Medical College and Ad-din Sakina Women's Medical College & Barrister Rafiq-Ui Huq Medical College will not take responsibility for the students' residential accommodation, however, available seats in the hostel will be allocated first come first serve basis.
16. Smoking is not permitted anywhere within the College and Hospital premises.
17. Those who are found involved in anti-social activities or violation of college discipline are liable to be punished up to expulsion from the college.

Teachers' Responsibility

Teachers are responsible for

- I. Following the principles of good professional practice and ethics and be a role model for the students.

Students' Responsibility

Students are responsible for

- I. Attending all teaching sessions, completing all assignments given by the faculty and maintaining academic discipline and being punctual.
- II. Executing their own learning and achieving the objectives set by the Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council (BMDC).
- III. Ensuring the patients' safety by working within the limits of their respective competencies.
- IV. Maintaining a cordial relationship with peers, hospital employees engaged in patient service and the community at large.
- V. Engaged in continuous self-improvement based on the systematic evaluation of their learning by the teachers, accepting positive criticism and mitigating self-deficiencies with the assistance of their teachers/mentors.

Discipline and Moral Values

1. Students are required to follow the moral codes and attend moral classes.
2. Regular prayers, as prescribed in the religion, are encouraged for every Muslim student.

Communication with Guardians

Constructive advice from the parents on College affairs is welcome. Parents are informed regularly about their son/daughters' academic performance and class attendance. They are also invited to put forward suggestions to improve the performance of the students.



The Duties of a Registered Doctor



A doctor must be able to obtain trust of a patient on his/her life and health. To justify trust, registered doctors must show respect for human life in the following ways :

1. Make patient care your first concern.
2. Protect and promote the health of patients and the public.
3. Provide a good standard of practice and care.
 - a. Keep professional knowledge and skills up to date
 - b. Recognise and work within the limit of their competence
 - c. Work with colleagues in the ways that best serve patients' interests
4. Treat patients as individuals and respect their dignity.
 - a. Treat patients politely and considerately
 - b. Respect patients' right to confidentiality
5. Work in partnership with patients.
 - a. Listen to patients and respond to their concerns and preferences
 - b. Give patients information they want or need in a way they can understand
 - c. Respect patients' right to reach decisions about their treatment and care
 - d. Support patients in caring for themselves to improve and maintain their health
6. Be honest and open and act with integrity.
 - a. Act without delay if doctors have good reason to believe that they or a colleague may be putting patients at risk
 - b. Never discriminate unfairly against patients or colleagues
 - c. Never abuse the patients' trust in doctors or the public's trust in the profession.

Good Medical Practice: Good Doctor

Patients need good doctors. Good doctors make patients' care as their first concern :

- They are competent,
- They keep their knowledge and skills up to date,
- They establish and maintain good relationship with patients and colleagues,
- They are honest and trustworthy, and
- They act with integrity.



All students completing the final Professional MBBS Examination shall be required to undergo a one-year internship programme as prescribed by Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council (BMDC) at the attached Hospitals of the Medical Colleges of Ad-din. The internship is compulsory and a prerequisite for obtaining regular registration from BMDC. The training is designed specifically to develop necessary skill and attitude to deal with common health problems, to work in hospitals and in the community. This training will be fully structured and rigorously supervised. The trainees will be entitled to appropriate subsistence allowances/honorariums as per agreement.

Geneva Declaration by the World Medical Association



In September 1948 the World Medical Association in Geneva adopted the following declaration, which is intended to be sworn when a doctor is admitted as a member of medical profession :

- I solemnly pledge myself to consecrate my life to the service of humanity. I will give to my teachers the respect and gratitude which is their due.
- I will practice my profession with conscience and dignity.
- The health of my patient will be my first consideration.
- I will respect the secrets, which are confided to me.
- I will maintain by all means the honour and noble tradition of the medical profession.
- My colleagues will be my brothers/sisters.
- I will not permit considerations of religion, nationality, race, party politics or social standing to intervene between my duty and my patient.
- I will maintain the utmost respect for human life from the time of conception.
- Even under threat I will not use my medical knowledge contrary to the laws of humanity.
- I make these promises solemnly, freely and upon my honour.
